College in the High School Program Expands



credit in Bible or philosophy through Bryan College, Tennessee.

Last year, our Advanced Biology course became a dual enrollment course (students receive both high school and college credit) through Harrisburg Area Community College. This three credit course is taught by our high school science teacher Mr. Chace at Shalom Christian Academy.

For the coming school year 2011-2012, we are adding at least three new three credit college classes. Our Advanced Math class will be replaced by two college math courses to be taught by Mr. Fretz. Students can earn three college credits in College Algebra in the fall semester and three college credits in Trigonometry in the spring semester. In order to take these courses, students must have taken Algebra II and Geometry as prerequisites. They also must score high enough on a placement test administered by Harrisburg Area Community College. The third new course for the coming year is psychology to be taught by Mr. Shank. In a semester, students can earn three college credits through Bluffton University, a Christian liberal arts college in Ohio.

Each of these college credit options require an application process and a small (very small compared to typical college costs!) fee. These courses are all open to juniors and seniors. Please contact Mr. Shank for more information.

For over a decade, senior students have been leaving school early to take college classes at such schools as Hagerstown Community College, Penn State Mont Alto, and Shippensburg University. For the coming school year, we are allowing juniors and seniors to leave as early as lunch time, if they are able to schedule their required/desired classes in the morning.

Also, our students have enjoyed success earning college credit through CLEP (College Level Examination Program). In this program, sponsored by the College Board, students take CLEP tests administered by a college or university. If they score high enough, they can earn college credit.

The first class to be offered for college credit at Shalom was our "Understanding the Times" Bible course. Students can earn college
